Books

All But My Life ~ by Gerda Weissmann Klein

The basis for the Emmy-winning documentary, "One Survivor Remembers," this is the memoir of a young Polish Jewish woman's enslavement by the Nazis and her liberation by American soldiers. (\$10.80)

Anne Frank ~ Curriculum Unit

Ten lessons provide historical background and creative activities to teach students to recognize the main themes in the diary and understand its implications in society. Includes objectives, notes, detailed procedures, quizzes, tests, and essay topics. (\$18.95)

Anne Frank: The Diary of a Young Girl

Diary of a German Jewish girl living in Holland and her family's years in hiding. (\$4.99)

Atlas of the Holocaust ~ by Martin Gilbert

This atlas includes 316 maps forming a cartographic journey through the phases of the Holocaust, from the antisemitic violence of prewar Germany to the Allied liberation. (\$25.00)

Bearing Witness ~ by Hazel Rochman and Darlene Z. McCampbell

Selections from the most seminal writings on the Holocaust in many different forms - short story, memoir, poetry, comic strip, and film script are included in this anthology. (\$8.95)

Classroom Strategies for Teaching about the Holocaust ~ by Ira Zornberg

Lesson plans, readings, and full page illustrations are combined to teach about the causes, effects, and implications of the Nazi Holocaust. Lessons compel students to consider enduring moral and ethical questions. (\$17.95)

Denying the Holocaust ~ by Deborah Lipstadt

Details and analyzes the rise of Holocaust denial. (\$12.55)

Escape from the Holocaust ~ by Kenneth Roseman

As a young Jewish medical student in Berlin in the 1930s, the author is confronted with choices that could mean the difference between freedom and slavery, life and death. (\$8.95)

Escape From Sobibor ~ by Richard Rashke

This book provides a vivid account of the largest escape from a death camp during World War II. (\$16.95)

Four Perfect Pebbles ~ by Lila Perl and Marian Blumenthal Lazan

Five-year-old Marion believes if only she can find four pebbles of the same size that her family will remain whole, even though the Nazis seem determined to destroy them all. This true story of one family's Holocaust ordeal is one of horror and hardship, but also of courage, hope, and the will to survive. (\$3.99)

Friedrich ~ by Hans Peter Richter

A tragic story of a Jewish boy and his family in Germany caught in the horror of the rise of the Nazi party and the Holocaust. (\$4.99)

Growing Up in the Holocaust ~ by Ben Edelbaum

A personal narrative about one boy, his family, and their experiences in the Lodz Ghetto and Nazi camps. (\$10.95)

Holocaust and Human Behavior, Resource Book ~ Facing History and Ourselves

This resource book is filled with stories, some historical fiction and some primary source material. The subject matter is the behavior, psychology, and history of intolerance and hatred. (\$24.00)

The Holocaust: A History of Courage and Resistance ~ Bea Stadler (text and discussion guide)

The background of the times is explained in depth--the rise of Hitler and the Nazi Party, Kristallnacht, the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising, passive and active resistance, the "Final Solution," etc... Stories of heroic Jewish men and women are highlighted. (\$8.95, \$8.95)

The Holocaust, the World and the Jews (text, student workbook, and teacher's guide)

This book uses primary source material to provide a unique view of the Holocaust. Over 100 photographs, excerpts from Nazi documents, maps, and transcripts of Nazi activities, as well as diaries and records of the victims are included. (\$9.95, \$5.25, \$15.95)

I Never Saw Another Butterfly ~ Hana Volavkova

Fewer than 100 of the 15,000 children who passed through Terezin survived. In these poems and pictures drawn by the young inmates, readers learn about the daily lives of these uprooted children. (\$15.75)

Night ~ by Elie Wiesel (classroom set of 30 copies)

Nobel laureate Elie Wiesel's attempt to find meaning in the horror of the Holocaust is a novel, but it is based so closely on his own experiences in Birkenau and Buchenwald that it is generally considered a memoir. (\$165.00)

Night ~ Curriculum Unit

Reproducible activities help develop reading comprehension, listening, and vocabulary skills in conjunction with the text. (\$18.95)

The Other Victims ~ by Ira Friedman

A series of personal stories from non-Jews persecuted by the Nazis. (\$6.95)

Smoke and Ashes ~ by Barbara Rogasky

This book examines the causes, events, and legacies of the Holocaust. (\$14.95)

Surviving Hitler ~ by Andrea Warren

Award-winning author Andrea Warren recounts Kansas City survivor Jack Mandelbaum's experiences in this true story of a boy growing up in the Holocaust. (\$18.00)

Tell Them We Remember ~ by Susan D. Bachrach (classroom set of 30 copies)

Features a comprehensive historical overview together with sidebar stories of more than 20 children who suffered or died in the camps and ghettos. Ten full-color and 80 black-and-white photographs lend immediacy, helping students identify with the victims. (\$448.50)

Terrible Things: An Allegory of the Holocaust ~ by Eve Bunting

Based on Pastor Niemoeller's quote, this allegory of the Holocaust offers a non-graphic introduction to the Holocaust. Forest animals are taken away, one type at a time, by the Terrible Things, not realizing that if fight for each other they might prevent their destruction. (\$7.95)

Twenty and Ten ~ by Clare Huchet Bishop

Twenty school children hide ten Jewish children in Nazi-occupied France during World War II. Historical Fiction (\$4.99)

Understanding the Holocaust ~ by Betty Merti

This book helps students grasp the historical context and chronology of the Holocaust. Students have opportunities to apply the lessons of the Holocaust to their own lives and to today's world events. (\$21.95)

Upon the Head of a Goat ~ by Aranka Siegal

This story is based on the author's survival from the time she first hears of Hitler to the day her family leaves for Auschwitz. (\$5.99)

The Upstairs Room ~ by Johanna Reiss

In this autobiographical novel, Johanna Reiss depicts the trials of her Dutch-Jewish family during World War II. The youngest of three daughters tells how she and her sister hid for more than two years in the upstairs room of a peasant family. (\$5.95)

The Wave ~ by Todd Strasser

Dramatization of an actual classroom experiment of individualism vs. conformity in which a high school teacher formed his own "Reich" to show how the German people embraced Nazism. (\$5.50)

We Are Witnesses ~ by Jacob Boas

Diaries of five teenagers who died in the Holocaust describe what it was like to be young in Nazi-occupied Europe. (\$4.50)

The World Must Know ~ by Michael Berenbaum

This book, illustrated with hundreds of archival photos and images of artifacts, offers a chronicle of the events of the Holocaust. Based on the Permanent Exhibition at the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum. (\$19.96)

Poster Sets and Visual Aids

Artifact Poster Set and Teaching Guide ~ USHMM

Photographs of artifacts from the Permanent Exhibition of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. These include: shoes collected at Birkenau, a Danish rescue boat, badges worn by camp inmates, a Ringelblum milkcan, a Roma woman being genetically profiled, and a deportation rail car.

Nazi Holocaust Series I

A selection of 31 captioned photographs depicting the Nazi campaign to murder the Jews during WWII. Pictures include German soldiers and civilians, SS troops, mass burials, children awaiting relocation, and concentration camps. (\$53.00) from Social Studies School Service

Nazi Holocaust Series II

A collection of 40 captioned photographs depicting the Nazi campaign to murder the Jews during WWII. Pictures include concentration camps, ghettos, and soldiers mistreating Jews, atrocities, prisoners, guards, officials, ovens, and the Allies. (\$69.95) from Social Studies School Service

The Holocaust ~ Jackdaw/Golden Owl

Reproductions of historic documents, maps, engravings, diaries, paintings, newspapers, letters, and other primary source documents. A comprehensive teacher's guide provides reproducible activities. (\$41.00)

Survivors: Testimonies of the Holocaust ~ CD-ROM

Testimonies combine the human perspective of survivor testimonies with the educational potential of interactive technology. (\$29.95)

Timeline of the Holocaust ~ Blackbirch Press

Horizontal panels show seven photos and describe 44 events from Hitler's rise to power through VE Day. (\$9.45)

Transparency Maps ~ USHMM

Four maps: Europe-1933, Europe-Major Nazi Camps, Poland-Major Ghettos 1939 to 1942, and Europe 1942-German Domination.

Videos

Assignment: Rescue ~ with guide and paperback (26 min.)

Meryl Streep narrates the story of Varian Fry, an American journalist and rescuer of Jewish refugees in Vichy, France whose work was not recognized by the French government until shortly before his death in 1967. In 1991, he was honored by United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, and in 1996, he was the first American to be honored at Yad Vashem in Israel.

Auschwitz, If You Cried, You Died ~ with guide (28 min.)

This film chronicles the journey of two Holocaust survivors, David Mandel and Mike Vogel as they revisit Auschwitz. The introduction provides an overview of the Holocaust.

Camera of My Family (18 min.)

Using family photographs, photographer Catherine Noren depicts the experiences of her German-Jewish family's life from 1845 to 1945. (\$69.95)

Courage to Care ~ with guide (30 min.)

This film depicts ordinary people who refused to countenance Nazi tyranny. They fed strangers, kept secrets, and provided hiding places – exceptional actions in an era of apathy and complicity. (\$69.95)

Daniel's Story

Issued in conjunction with the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum exhibit, this composite story is based on experiences of real children who lived at the time of the Holocaust.

Escape from Sobibor (118 min.)

This docudrama, based on the book by Richard Raschke, provides a vivid account of the largest escape from a death camp during World War II. Starring Alan Arkin, Rutger Hauer and Johanna Pakula. (\$8.98)

Green Eggs and Ham & Other Stories *Suggested: "The Sneetches" (30 min.)

This animated film contains three Dr. Seuss stories including one about the very prejudiced "Sneetches who live on the beaches." (\$7.95)

The Long Way Home (119 min.)

This film describes the struggles of Jewish displaced persons in Europe, from the liberation of the camps to the founding of the State of Israel. Using archival footage and photographs, memoirs, letters, diaries, and oral histories combined with recent interviews, it looks at conditions in the displaced persons camps and the role of the United States and Great Britain. Narrated by Morgan Freeman. (\$25.00)

One Survivor Remembers (39 min.)

Gerda Weissmann Klein, author of *All But My Life*, recounts her Holocaust experiences in a ghetto, several concentration camps, and a death march. Academy Award winner for Best Documentary Short film. (\$95.00)

Scapegoating: Impact of Prejudice ~ with guide (30 min.)

This film seeks to define scapegoating and examines its causes and consequences. (\$75.00)

Survivors of the Holocaust (70 mn.)

This film features interviews with Holocaust survivors and children of survivors, describing their lives before, during, and after the war, interspersed with photographs and archival footage. (\$16.99)

Weapons of the Spirit ~ with guide (35 min.)

Inspired by their courageous pastor, the villagers of Le Chambon-sur-Lignon in south central France risked their lives to provide safety and refuge for 5,000 Jews. The filmmaker, Pierre Sauvage, was born while his parents were hiding in the village.

Witnesses: Life Unworthy of Life (part of kit)

Compiled from Nazi footage of the Warsaw Ghetto between 1940 and 1943. Jews are shown attempting to maintain their religious practices, educate their young, and survive. Survivors tell of their experiences.

Edited Videos from MCHE's Witness Project of 1994

Madeleine ~ Member of the French Resistance; spent over two years in Ravensbruck, Mauthausen

Clara ~ Hungarian survivor of Auschwitz; age 15 when liberated

Ann ~ Polish survivor who was in hiding throughout most of the war

Werner ~ German survivor who went with his family to Shanghai, China, in 1940 at the age of 30

Liberators ~ Four local liberators' observations and reactions

Witnesses to the Holocaust ~ 4 tapes: German Jews, Ghettos, In Hiding, Liberation (\$54.00)

Teaching Kits

Life Unworthy of Life ~ includes teacher notebook, student book, and video

Designed to stimulate active student participation in analysis of historical events, activities include viewing of videotaped survivor testimony, participation in simulations, analysis of primary documents, and discussion of ethical issues. (\$117.81)

The Shadow of Hate: A History of Intolerance in America ~ Southern Poverty Law Center

Video contains historical footage and personal stories. The text is 128 pages of stories, documents, and photographs. The Teacher's Guide contains adaptable day-by-day lesson plans. (\$30.00)

The Armenians: Shadows of Forgotten Genocide

The original model of genocide in the 20th century was, perhaps, the Armenian population of Turkey. This outrage was publicly well known during the killings, but the world did little to help and quickly ignored this inconvenient reality.

Guidelines for Teaching the Holocaust CD-ROM

This CD-ROM is designed to illustrate the "Guidelines for Teaching about the Holocaust" published by the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. It is an ideal pedagogical tool to use in conjunction with the text.

“The Holocaust” – Star in Education supplement

Resistance During the Holocaust ~ USHMM

This booklet explores examples of armed and unarmed resistance by Jews and other Holocaust victims. Also includes examples of spiritual resistance such as the continuance of religious traditions and the preservation of cultural institutions.

Sinti and Roma, Homosexuals, Handicapped, Jehovah’s Witnesses, Poles booklets ~ USHMM

Five booklets on other victims of Nazi persecution.

Teaching About the Holocaust: A Resource Book for Educators ~ USHMM

Provides guidelines for teaching about the Holocaust, a historical summary and chronology, and an annotated bibliography and videography on Holocaust-related topics.

USHMM Identification Cards (2)

Each card is designed as a small booklet to help personalize the historical events of the time, and represents the stories of the victims of the Holocaust. Half tell the stories of survivors, and the other half tell the experiences of those who died.

USHMM Reproducible Identification Cards Notebook

A set of 37 identification cards reproduced on 8 1/2" x 11" paper for easy distribution and reproduction. Portrays a wide range of experiences of people during the Holocaust.

Voices of the Past ~ Klaus Frank

This is a personal narrative of a Kansas City area survivor’s life before, during, and after the Holocaust.
